The Holy Gospel The Reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Mark. (10: 32-45)

At that time, Jesus took His twelve Disciples, and began to tell them what was to happen to Him, saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes, and they will condemn Him to death, and deliver Him to the Gentiles. And they will mock Him, and scourge Him, and spit upon Him, and kill Him; and after three days He will rise." And James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Him, and said to Him, "Teacher, we would that thou shouldest do for us whatsoever we shall desire" And Jesus said to them, "What do you want Me to do for you?" And they said to Him, "Grant us to sit, one at Thy right hand and one at Thy left, in Thy glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" And they said to Him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized. But to sit at My right hand or at My left is not Mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." And when the ten heard it, they began to be indignant at James and John. And Jesus called them to Him and said to them, "You know that those who are supposed to rule over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. But it shall not be so among you; but whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be servant of all. For the Son of man also came not to be served but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."

Bible Time



Mark 10: 32-45 † April 2, 2017

Amazed and Afraid Today's Gospel begins with Jesus and the apostles walking up towards Jerusalem. This is a journey they had surely made before; each year, the Jews would journey to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. But this journey to Jerusalem was different. As they walked behind Jesus, the Gospel says that the apostles were amazed, and then it goes on to say they were afraid. Why were they amazed? Why were they afraid? Why was this journey into Jerusalem so very different from the other times they came to visit this Holy city for the Passover?

The Lamb Walks I am sure the apostles pondered many things as they walked along the road towards Jerusalem. Jesus had previously told the apostles that He was going to Jerusalem to suffer and die. What do you think they might suddenly have understood about Jesus, and their trip, that would have caused them to be amazed and afraid? Perhaps they were amazed to see the Lamb waking toward the slaughter. Perhaps they were afraid for both Jesus and for themselves. Jesus knew what they were thinking and He took some time along their walk to repeat the predictions He previously made. He reminds them of the terrifying events that will soon happen, not to frighten them, but to encourage and strengthen them — He is essentially saying to them that "we are going to Jerusalem so that I can be betrayed, condemned, mocked, beaten, and then killed, but on the third day I will rise again. I know where I am going, and what will happen and I willingly going." How amazing is our Jesus?

True Greatness After Jesus reminds the apostles of the events that will soon happen, James and John (the sons of Zebedee), ask Jesus if they can sit on either side of Christ in His glory. Why would these disciples ask for such a thing? It seems of that after Jesus just tells them of all the suffering He will willingly accept, that they ask Him for power and glory. Of course Jesus does not lack the authority to bestow power to whomever He desires, but He answers them lovingly and tells them that these places of honor in the Kingdom of God are not randomly given; these seats of honour have been previously prepared and established. Jesus goes on to tell the apostles that they will indeed share in the cup (the persecution) and the baptism (the martyrdom) that will come after Pentecost. Christ is again strengthening the apostles; He is sowing in them seeds of strength and trust – so that when they are later persecuted, they will remember that Jesus forewarned them. They will also be strengthened when they understand that He has overcome

the world and its persecution, and that He is with them! Not only does Jesus willingly accept what He will endure, He is preparing His disciples for what is to come.

Being a Leader By the world's standard, a leader is someone who holds a high place of honour and strength; they speak and people listen, they do and people follow. But Jesus gave a different view of a leader, actually one that is opposite to what the world says. The world's leaders expect others to bow to them and serve them. But Jesus said that if we are to be His followers (God's children) we need to do the opposite; we must never see ourselves as being greater than others; in fact, we are called to serve others. Jesus Himself, the Great Shepherd, did not come to be served, He came to serve! Our Great Shepherd, our leader, became the Lamb of God, our sacrifice.

Dear Jesus, Lord Jesus, we thank You for willingly walking towards Jerusalem. We are grateful that You willingly accepted to suffer and die for us on the Cross. You are the creator of the universe and You became our sacrificial lamb. You died for us, and today we say that we want to live for You. We love You Lord. Amen.
